ALL-CLASSES REUNION SET FOR 1992

In the last newsletter we mentioned that an all-classes reunion was supposed to be set for 1991 in Las Vegas, and at our business meeting in San Antonio we agreed to work with the planners and attend. However, it seemed we could find no one who was doing the planning, so we decided to go ahead with our own chapter reunion, which we're having in San Diego, and work towards a 1992 all-classes reunion.

Several alumni, especially from the '50s Chapter, have expressed the feeling that they probably wouldn't want to "party" with alumni young enough to be their kids (and vice-versa I suppose!). Therefore, I think it's important to explain the reasoning behind trying an all-classes reunion. We all have a common bond that could make having a reunion together very rewarding. There is an advantage to having a reunion in one location rather than four chapters holding four separate reunions, in that we could more effectively bargain for better rates and amenities. Chapters whose members are burned out by having to plan reunions could be given a respite by having a Reunion Planner and others plan this reunion for them. Many Classes are not yet organized enough to have their own reunions and would dearly love to attend one. With the

splitting up of alumni into separate "Chapters" has come the splitting up of many classes from other classes they've attended school with for two of their three years at FHS. I know that in our own chapter, quite a few alumni from the Class of 1967, for example, know at least as many people from the '64-'66 crowd as our group, which makes it difficult for them to know which reunion they should attend. With an all-classes reunion, they would be given the chance to see old friends from both chapters. For me personally, and probably quite a few of you, this separating out of Chapters has also meant separating siblings into different chapters. Reunions are a chance for siblings to get together, too, and they'd like to see their old friends at the same time.

Consequently, the general plan is that, given enough participation, we would have about three hospitality suites catering to the different eras. We'd like to have memorabilia displays from all the classes; I think it would be fascinating to see what Frankfurt High looked like before many of us were even born, as well as the changes it (and a lot of our old faculty) has gone through in the years since we've left. We would offer dinner dances with the music of different eras. In other words, participants would have the freedom to stick with their own crowd, or

mingle with others when they so desire.

Bruce Jones '60 and I have polled Class Reps from 1948 to 1984, and it has been decided that the reunion should be held in June 1992, with the location to be Denver, Colorado. A down-town location within a block of the 16th Street Mall and lots of restaurants, and shopping, and nightclubs will be chosen. It was overwhelmingly agreed that, due to the complexity of attempting to plan a reunion spanning 45 years and over 2100 alumni, a Reunion Planner should be used. * A '69 Bios booklet was printed in 1989. \$60.00 was collected in that calendar year, but no reimbursements were made until all expenses were identified, which was early 1990. \$18.00 was received in 1990, for a total of \$78.00, the amount of the reimbursement.

We are in the black! Our Chapter had a net income of \$710.17 for 1990 and, coupled with revenues carried over from 1989 (\$464.10), we had a cash balance at the end of 1990 of **\$1,174.27**. This should pay for the expenses we will be generating with this newsletter, the reunion flyer, and the 1992 Directory. As you can see above, our expenses in 1990 were \$2,064.33, so we do need your continued support through payment of your 1991 dues.

The Reunion Fund now stands at **\$161.68**, which should give us a reasonable cushion in case of unforeseen expenses.

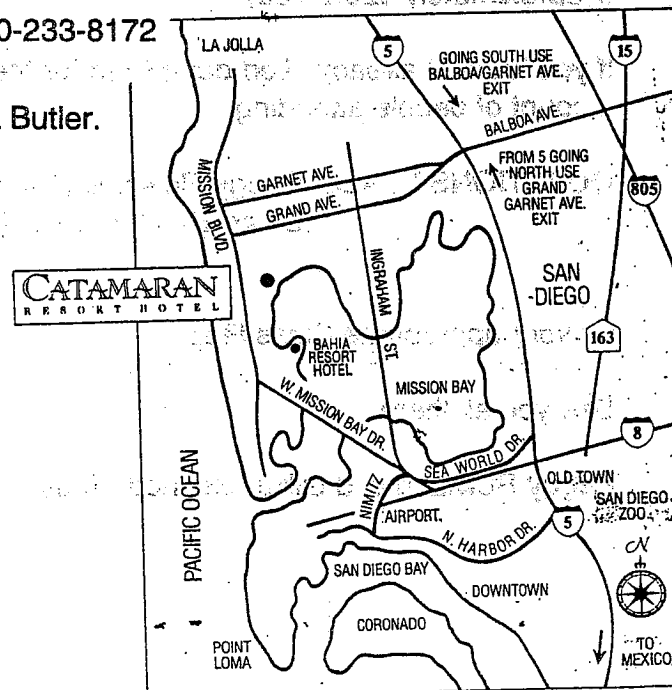

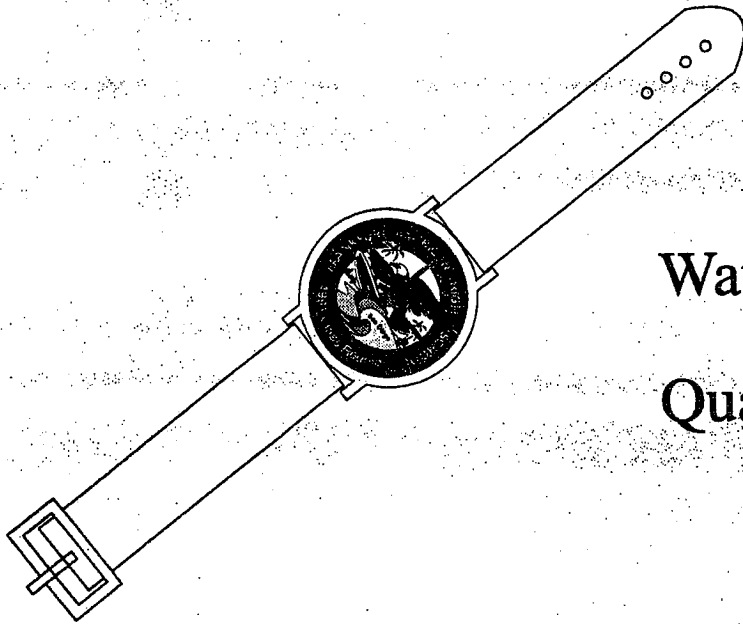
