



My First High School Reunion

I graduated from FHS in June of 1968. I was accepted to start college in the fall. We left Germany in the

morning of August

20.

A Letter from Dr. Gaugler

17 Jul 1999

Dear Frankfurt Alumni:

My thanks for the kind invitation to join the reunion at Breckenridge in early August, and for the copies of the *Bald Eagles Echo* with news of alumni events. It is touching to be remembered, and delightful to learn what our former students have accomplished. I deeply regret that I cannot be with you, but my wife is very ill and cannot easily travel.

I have fond memories of the three and one half years that I was on the faculties of the University of Maryland, European Division, and Frankfurt American High School. The intellectual curiosity, self-discipline, and affection of the students have remained fixed in my mind for thirty years. Indeed, I have a clearer recollection of students from that era than I do of many of the students who attended my classes and graduate seminars at San Jose State University in recent years. There is a freshness and frankness in younger students that disappears in later years.

Of my former colleagues I have only been in touch with Mr. Geral Martin. The photographs of Mr. Meacham and Mr. Sonnier brought to mind other

colleagues at the high school with whom I enjoyed working.

Since 1996 I have been retired, except for publication of archaeological materials, and the Fencing Masters Program, which I initiated twenty years ago at the University. In certain respects it had its beginning at Frankfurt American High School where, as some of you may recall, Maestro Amilcare Angelini gave lessons, and I acted as his assistant. The fruit of this work is evident in my fencing publications, which some of my former students might enjoy reading, along with the autobiography of my first fencing teacher, Maestro Aldo Nadi. Copies of Maestro Nadi's volume, The Living Sword, for which I wrote the introduction, and my three books, The Science of Fencing, A Dictionary of Universally Used Fencing Terminology, and The History of Fencing, can be obtained by calling Laureate Press 1-800-946-2727.

You are welcome to reproduce this letter and publish it, or duplicate it for distribution at the Breckenridge gathering. I wish all of you a pleasant reunion, and want you to know that I shall always remember you with great affection.





heart of all FHS Alumni was always recognizable, through the family that we once were, in good ole Frankfurt, Germany.



Editor's Note: I received a letter from Elaine Collier, Jim Rost's sister. She had found our alumni association newsletter on Jim's desk and sent me news of his death. Elaine graciously agreed to write the following about her brother for our newsletter:

The website is great and thank you very much for recognizing Jim under "Thinking of You". I know Jim was excited and really looking forward to going to the reunion this year. That is why I sent you the obituary notice. I think he would have wanted you to know.

You asked for more information on Jim for the newsletter:

Jim was single (divorced), and has four children that live in Minnesota. He turned 51 years old on May 19th, two days before his accident.

The Army was his life. He was an E-8, Master Sergeant, in Helicopter Maintenance when he retired in Alaska July 1992. During his military career he was stationed at Hawaii; Fort Bragg, NC; Fort Rucker, AL; Fort Carson, CO; Korea and Alaska.

Upon retiring he moved to Florida to be near family. About a year later he purchased a 1989 Honda, 1500cc Interstate, Goldwing Motorcycle. This was Jim's pride and joy. The friend that was riding with him the day of the accident said he was very happy. He was doing what he loved when he died.

Jim loved to travel on the motorcycle and made many touring trips on the bike around the United States. As a matter of fact he was on a vacation

trip to Key West, Florida when the accident occurred. He was pulling a small camper and the rear tire went down causing the trailer to fishtail, and he lost control of the motorcycle. I believe Jim would have brought the bike to a safe stop, had there not been a trailer on the back.

Jim was a very active, out going and hard working person. Always busy doing something, never idle except to sleep. Went to truck driving school and drove a semi tractor/trailer rig for about eight months, between getting his two degrees.

Jim had completed a General Business Degree at Pensacola Junior College and was working on his second degree. He only had one class left to complete this fall, then in December 1999 he would have completed his Engineering degree.
