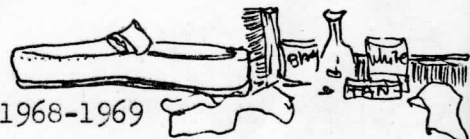
On May 2nd, the girls received the chance many of them had been waiting for. The BYOB, Bring Your Own Boy, was a great success, for the girls as well as for the boys.

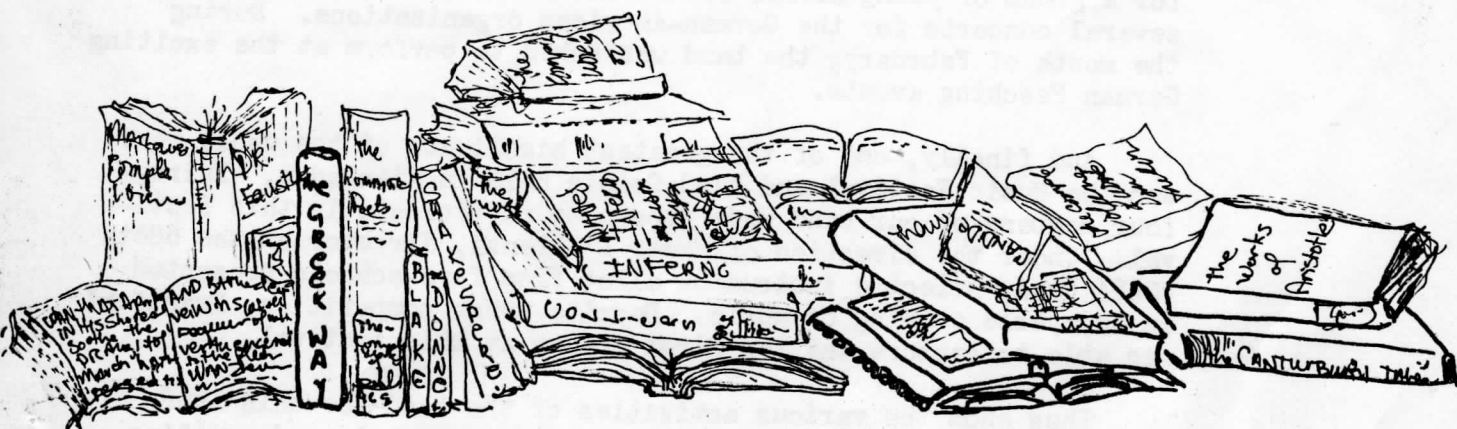



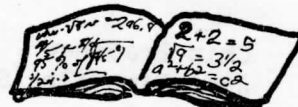

Sweatshirts, surfer shirts, and FHS pennants were sold in order to raise money and promote school spirit.

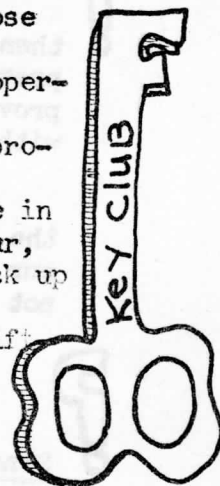

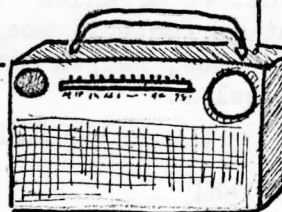
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RADIO CLUB

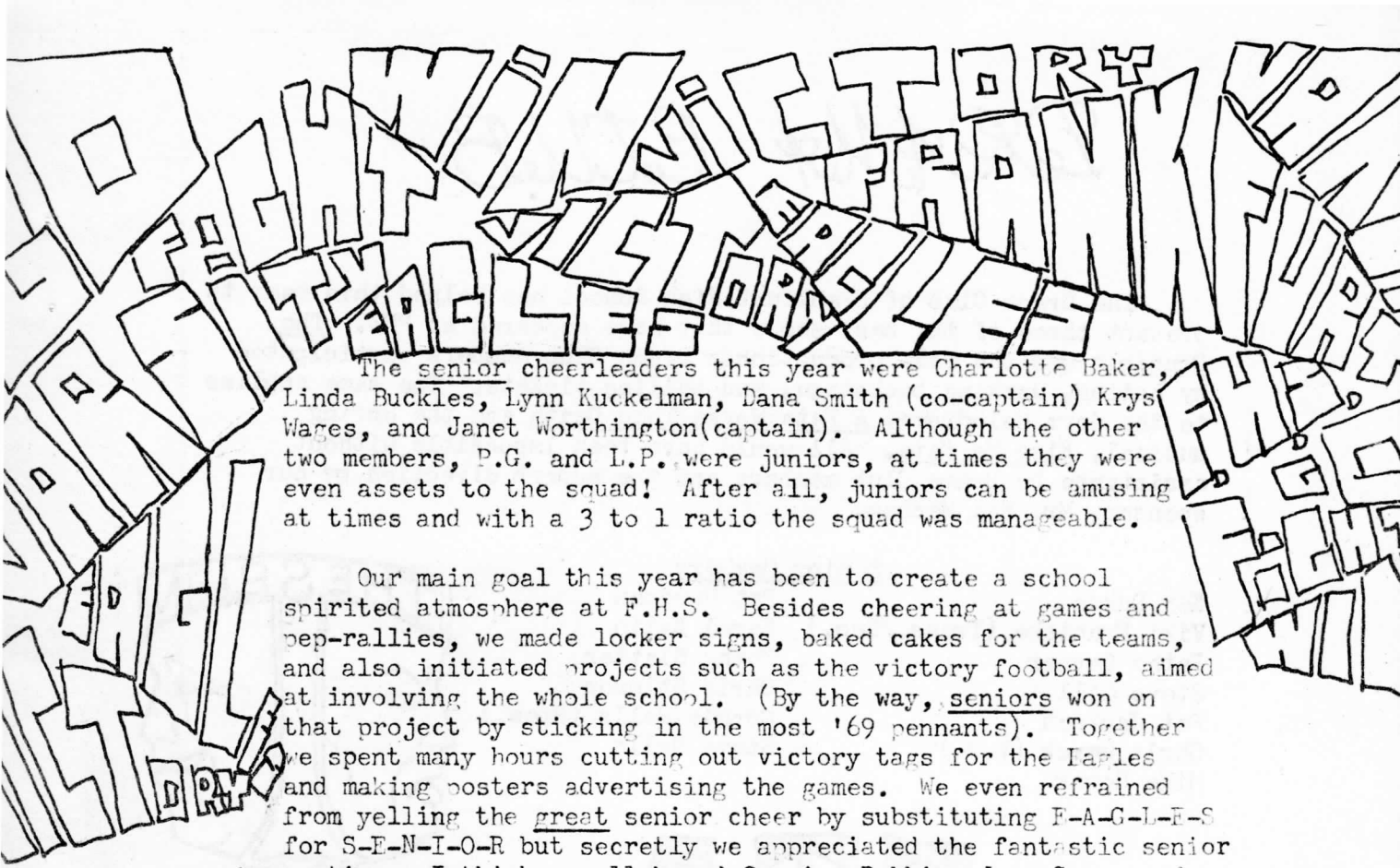


“FOLK CLUB”

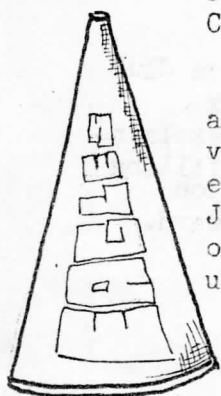
We have met each week, once a week for practice and on several other occasions, also.

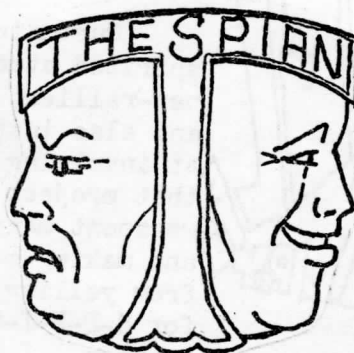


DRAMA CLUB

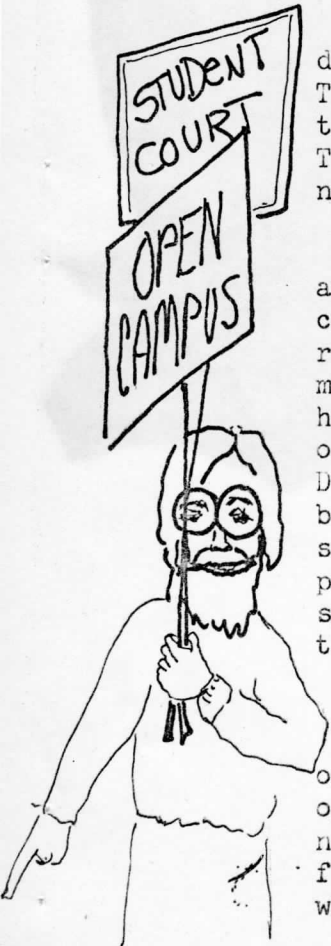

For the first time in its history, the Student Council passed a resolution voicing the opinion of the House of Representatives concerning a controversial issue which embroiled the school. Discounting previously the entertainment image, the service may be also----the Council should function in a leadership capacity, service clubs (Key Club, Keyettes, etc) exist for the purpose of performing useful services for the school. Revamping the election system is another example of leadership initiative, as well as is the establishment of a new level of student faculty communications.

In summary, the year having run out, the Council has a list of proposals to be voted on in the coming year----open campus, open dress code, new Handbook, new constitution. With the beginnings of a new image, it is to be hoped the coming Council will find and stimulate a more receptive and eager student body, one which will participate from the inception of projects.
